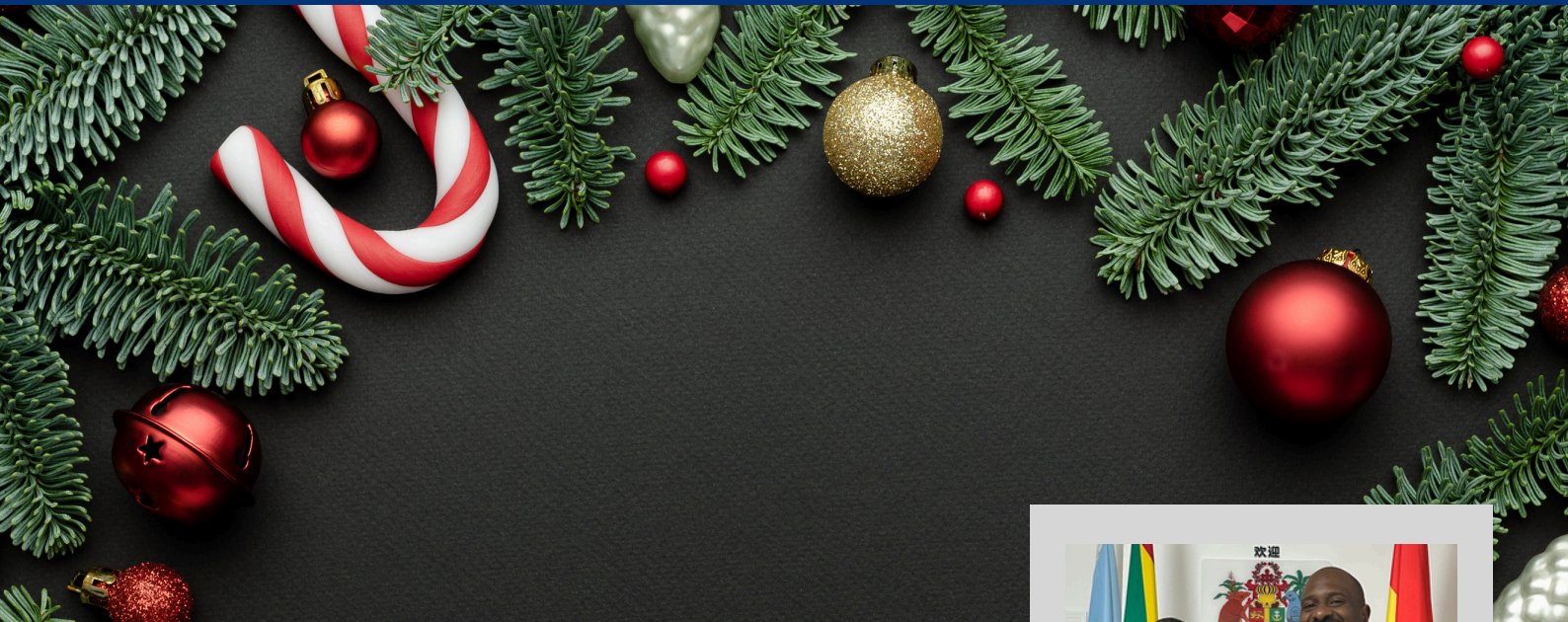

During his tenure, Mr. Abraham spearheaded significant milestones, including implementing the Renewable Energy Project, IT network upgrades, renovating training spaces, and establishing the Caribbean Center of Excellence in Research, Innovation, and Workforce Training. He holds a Master of Business Administration (MBA) in Management, a Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) in Computer Information Systems, an Associate of Applied Science in Environmental Technology and a Certificate in Teaching Effectiveness from Humber College. He is a current PhD candidate in Creativity, Leadership, and Innovation for Change at the University of the Virgin Islands and a product of the Grenada National College.

Mr. Abraham's international experience is a valuable asset to the institution. With his extensive experience in lecturing, curriculum development, institutional management, and project management—locally and internationally—Mr. Abraham is well-positioned to further elevate the institution's esteemed reputation. 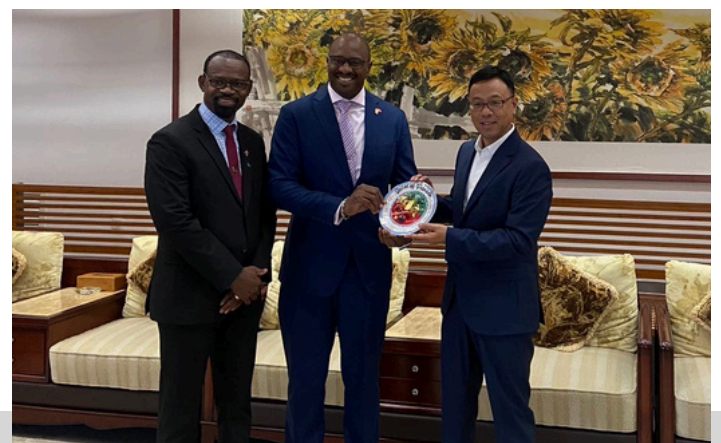
During his visit to the Ningbo University of Technology on November 19, 2024, Principal Abraham, Dr Jiang Fan Director of the Confucius Institute at TAMCC, and Mr. Ian Marshall, Grenada's Resident Ambassador to China, engaged in meaningful discussions with officials, including Professor Shao Qianjun, President of Ningbo University of Technology, and Mr. Chen Jinhui, Deputy Director General of the Ningbo Education Bureau.

With Ambassador Marshall's assistance, Principal Abraham secured five prestigious scholarships from The Ningbo Municipal People's Government Education Bureau. This remarkable achievement includes four bachelor's degree scholarships dedicated to deserving students within the Automotive Service Technology and Building Technology programmes and one master's degree dedicated to a faculty member at the college, aimed at enhancing international educational opportunities and fostering cultural exchange.

TAMCC LEADERSHIP MEETS WITH RGPF TO PROMOTE CAMPUS SECURITY AND COLLABORATION

The meeting, which took place on Monday November 25, 2024, focused on implementing enhanced security measures for the college's campuses and exploring partnerships that promote capacity building for the police force through education.

The team from TAMCC included Deputy Principal for Academic Leadership and Strategic Initiatives, Dr. John Telesford, Director of Student Affairs, Ms. Eslyn Lewis and Coordinator for Community Service, Mr. Kwabena Mehutusekamen. The RGPF was represented by Commissioner of Police, Don Mc Kenzie, Deputy Commissioner of Police Jessmon Prince and Assistant Commissioners of Police Randy Connaught and Vannie Curwen.

During the discussions, members of the RGPF presented suggestions and outlined various relevant areas that would assist in not only boosting security protocols across all TAMCC's Campuses but would treat in changing the mindset of the young people who attend the College, resulting in a safe environment

conducive to learning. The suggestions given by the RGPF were met with strong support by the College's Senior Administration who noted that student safety is of paramount importance.

Additionally, the parties explored the potential for the community college to offer specialized courses designed to develop skills relevant to law enforcement. These programs will aim to equip local police officers with knowledge in areas such as crisis management, community policing, and conflict resolution, ensuring they are well-prepared to serve the community effectively.

"As a College we are rightly positioned to provide capacity building resources to the RGPF. We have our traditional programmes that we offer but we believe that there are areas, be it crime fighting, cyber security or any certification the RGPF may have in mind, to build capacity across the police force. We as an institution are ready and willing to engage and provide that support to our entire community, not just limited to high-school graduates," said Principal, Mr. Abraham.

The meeting concluded with a commitment to ongoing dialogue and collaboration between TAMCC and the RGPF, signaling a strong partnership aimed at enhancing the College's security measures and professional development for law enforcement. Both parties are optimistic that these discussions will lead to actionable strategies that promote not only a safer campus environment but also a more capable police force serving Grenada.



TAMCC MIRABEAU CAMPUS UNDERGOES MAJOR REFURBISHMENT

In a move aimed at strengthening collaboration and enhancing educational opportunities, Principal of the T. A. Marrayshow Community College, Mr. Andrew Abraham accompanied by Deputy Principal for Academic Leadership and Strategic Initiatives Dr. John Telesford, made a courtesy visit to the office of Provost at St. George's University, Dr. Glen Jacobs on Tuesday December 10, 2024.

During the meeting, Mr. Andrew expressed his enthusiasm for increased partnerships between the two institutions, highlighting the importance of community engagement, curriculum development and workforce training in today's educational and technological landscape.

Dr. Jacobs welcomed the visit, emphasizing the university's commitment to the College as a vital partner in higher education. The two leaders discussed various ideas, including joint degree programs, shared resources and campus safety and security, aimed at enhancing the level of tertiary education in

Grenada. Both institutions are optimistic about the potential for a strong partnership that will ultimately benefit students and the surrounding community.

The meeting concluded, with a promise for follow-up discussions to further outline potential collaborative projects, marking the continuation of a fruitful alliance between the T. A. Marrayshow Community College and St. George's University.

Currently, the College and University have arrangements in place which give students who have gained an associate degree the opportunity to transfer credits achieved during their studies at TAMCC toward their Bachelor degree at the University. As a result, TAMCC graduates can complete a bachelor degree within SGU's School of Arts and Science in two to three years instead of the standard four years it would take without the transfer of credits.

The Skills to Access the Green Economy-03 (SAGE-03) Project officially concluded on December 12, 2024 with a vibrant closing ceremony held at the T. A. Marrayshow Community College. The initiative, which fostered a collaborative partnership between the International Marine Institute, Memorial University, Nova Scotia Community College, the Canadian Government, and T. A. Marrayshow Community College, aimed to develop an Associate Degree in Environmental Technology programme and facilitate educational fieldwork opportunities in Canada and Grenada for students.

The ceremony was attended by representatives from partnering institutions, educators, and students who celebrated the achievements of the project, which has significantly enhanced the educational landscape for aspiring environmental professionals in Grenada and the wider Caribbean region. The initiative was designed not only to equip students with essential skills for the green economy but also to promote sustainable practices that can be implemented locally.

The project was launched with the goal of creating an innovative curriculum that aligns with international standards while addressing local environmental issues. The newly developed associate degree program focuses on practical skills in environmental technology, marine conservation, and sustainable resource management.

In addition to the academic curriculum, the project successfully funded several study tours to Canada for Grenadian students and to Grenada for Canadian students, where they engaged in hands-on environmental fieldwork. These experiences provided invaluable exposure for TAMCC's students to advanced research practices and technologies being implemented in Canadian institutions.

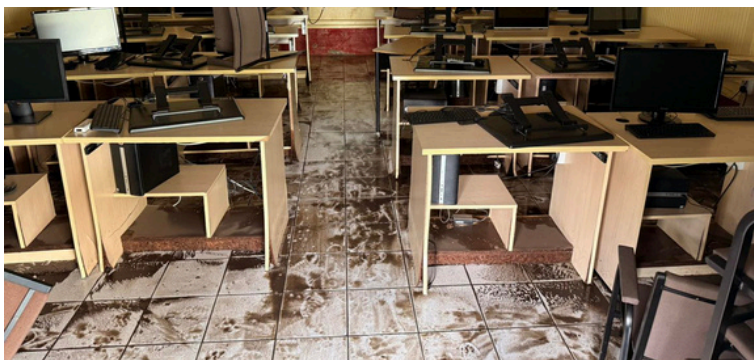
The closing ceremony featured testimonials from students who showcased their project and research findings, highlighting the impact of their studies on local environmental initiatives.

The OECS Skills and Innovation Project is a five-year initiative designed to enhance the relevance and quality of Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) in OECS Member States. the project is coordinated by the OECS Education Development Management Unit in

TAMCC Launches Carpentry Apprenticeship Training Programme

Ten young individuals, comprising of nine males and one female, have been given the opportunity to participate in the second installment of the one-year Carpentry Apprenticeship Training Programme. The programme, a collaboration between the T. A. Marryshow Community College, Creative Designs and Building Construction Co. Ltd, Grenada National Training Agency and Skills to Access the Green Economy (SAGE), aims to provide individuals with hands-on training, mentorship, and the necessary skills to thrive in the carpentry field.

Following the success of its inaugural year, which saw eight (8) apprentices complete their training and secure employment, the programme has been expanded to accommodate a new cohort of aspiring carpenters eager to develop their skills in this essential trade.

All participants signed a one-year contract of employment with Creative Designs and Building Construction Co. Ltd. and will receive a monthly salary with an additional daycare allowance available for any apprentice with a child aged 0-4 years old. They will also be provided with appropriate tools and PPE provided by SAGE.

The programme is structured to combine classroom learning which will take place at the College with on-the-job experience, covering a breadth of topics with on-the-job training which they will receive while working under the guidance of seasoned

carpenters, gaining real-world experience that prepares them for a successful career in the industry. Upon completion of the training, participants will receive a CVQ Level II qualification from the Grenada National Training Agency (GNTA).

This initiative further signifies TAMCC's mission to secure its place as a leader in vocational training and workforce development. TAMCC urges every participant of this year's apprenticeship programme to take advantage of this opportunity and aim for greatness.

Two members of the library staff, Mrs. Leslie Ann Campbell and Ms. June James, facilitated the outreach programme at the St. George's Anglican Senior School on Church Street, St. George. The initial target was Grades 5 and 6 but due to activities undertaken by the school for Child's Month, TAMCC's library staff read to the entire school. As on previous occasions, it was well received by both the students and staff of the school. The students were engaged and eagerly answered all the questions posed by the library staff who gave them prizes for every correct answer. Mrs. Campbell presented the principal of the school, Mr. Nigel DeGale with some encyclopedias and a copy of *The Kayak Tourist: a story for children* by D. E. Ambrose, Dean of the School of Art, Science and Professional Studies.

The outreach program, coordinated by Mrs. Campbell, other library staff and a point person at the designated establishment targets primary and secondary schools, Homes for children and Homes for senior citizens. The goals are to promote reading, promote books by our local authors, encourage collaborative work among library staff and to build a rapport between the TAMCC community and the wider Grenadian community.

In an effort to ensure the success of these outreach initiatives, the library staff engages in fund raising activities and pool funds to purchase books, toiletries, snacks and other necessary items to present to the establishments selected.

A sixth outreach program is scheduled for December 2024 for the Christmas Season. TAMCC commends the library staff for this outreach programme and for the work they are doing to represent the TAMCC Community in a positive light and bring books and reading to the wider Grenadian Community.

Eight students of the T. A. Marryshow Community College enrolled in the two-year Associate Degree programme in Environmental Technology have journeyed to Canada to complete a study tour at the Marine Institute in Newfoundland.

The students, accompanied by three members of faculty and staff, will be in Canada from September 14 to 22. They will be engaged in environmental field work, tech support classes and training in small vessel handling and operation.

This the third year the Environmental Technology programme is being offered at the College and the second cohort of students doing the study tour. The programme, developed by the Marine Institute, Nova Scotia Community College and the TAMCC, integrates society, economy and environment and equips students with the skills to understand and solve problems relating to local and regional environmental problems with a specific focus on the coastal zone and ocean.

The trip is a part of the Skills to Access the Green Economy (SAGE) project, sponsored by the Government of Canada and executed by Colleges and Institutes- Canada. Five other Caribbean Colleges are also involved with the project.

TAMCC wishes the students the best and urges them to take advantage of this opportunity which will equip them with skills needed to contribute to solving the environmental problems faced by Grenada and the wider Caribbean region.

LIBRARY HOSTS SUCCESSFUL RECYCLE WEEK EVENT

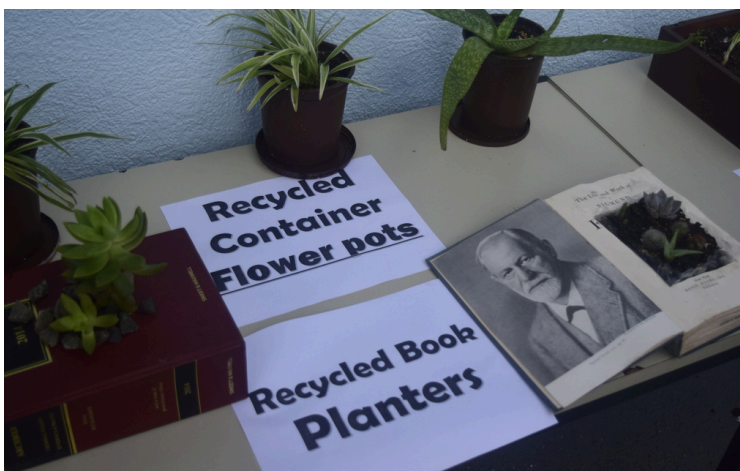

- Tanteen Campus - Blue

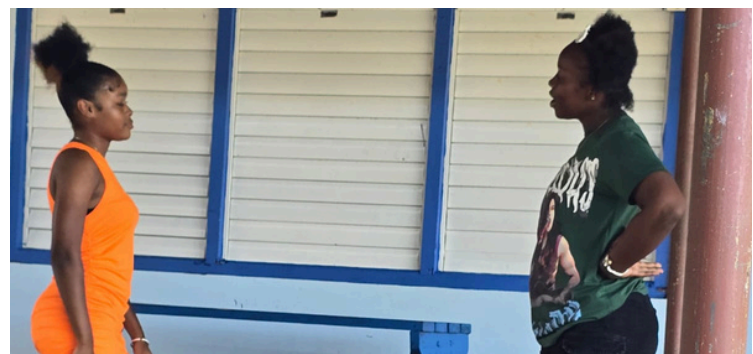
The day's activity ended with a karaoke in which both students and staff participated.
